#### 1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Councilor Lewis called the Metro Council Meeting to order at 10:30 a.m.

#### 2. Public Communication

Councilor Lewis opened the meeting to members of the public wanting to testify on a non-agenda items.

<u>Malcolm Ricks, Portland:</u> Testified on behalf of My Brother's Keeper to ask Council to reconsider including them in the budget.

<u>Sheila Harris, Portland</u>: Reiterated Rick's testimony, urging Council to increase their budget for a contract with My Brother's Keeper.

<u>Tony Jones, Portland</u>: Also testified requesting Council to increase the WPES budget for a contract with My Brother's Keeper, detailing the ways in which this would fall in line with Metro's racial and economic equity goals.

Councilor Lewis called on Brian Kennedy (he/him), CFO,

Metro, to answer questions from Council.

Kennedy explained that Oregon law requires Metro to readopt the investment policy annually, and gave a brief summary of the investment strategy that they use.

Councilor Lewis asked how the Zoo Bond measure funds will be invested, and Kennedy explained that those funds will be taken into account and balanced against their liquid funds so that the Zoo has plenty available for their capital projects as they need it.

Councilor Lewis called on Jon Blasher (he/him), Metro, and Community Members to present to Council.

Staff pulled up the Resolution No. 24-5317 For the Purpose of Approving 2023 Nature in Neighborhoods Community Stewardship and Restoration Community Grants PowerPoint to present to Council.

Presenters described Metro's longstanding grant program, which has supported fish and wildlife habitat creation and connected people with nature for nearly two decades. They introduced the latest round of Neighborhood Nature Grants, emphasizing the program's alignment with Metro's racial equity, diversity, and inclusion strategy. These grants aim to build partnerships, enhance water quality and habitat, and promote environmental equity. This year's review saw an increase in applications and funding requests, leading to the recommendation of nine projects. Highlighted projects include the Seven Waters Canoe Family's culturally focused habitat work, Friends of Trees' urban tree care training, and

Willamette Falls Trust's habitat restoration led by tribal members. The emphasis on youth mentorship, Indigenous leadership, and community engagement underscores the program's commitment to sustainable, inclusive environmental stewardship.

#### Council Discussion:

Councilor Lewis asked how the project grant cycle interacts with the capital grant cycle, and presenters explained that in the past the cycles have aligned with each other and it has been really hard on staff, so they are coming up with new strategies to stagger those for the next cycle.

They also noted the importance of Metro's commitment to BIPOC communities and proposed future council discussions to explore expanding support programs, ensuring that BIPOC businesses are prepared for successful contracting opportunities.

Councilor Lewis added that they are interested in looking at the budget and reserves to bring more resources and opportunities of this kind.
