Agenda Item Title: Demonstration of Safe Streets Fatal Crash Dashboard and safe streets resources

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Purpose/Objective: Provide a demonstration of the Fatal Crash Dashboard and other safety dashboards and resources. Answer questions related to the dashboards and data resources available to jurisdictional and community partners. Receive input on what type of questions JPACT members would like to answer with current and future dashboards and resources.

Outcome: JPACT members are aware of the dashboards and understand the questions they can answer.

What has changed since JPACT last considered this issue/item? Metro provides monthly traffic death updates and an annual transportation safety update to JPACT. In addition to these updates, Metro provides regularly updated and publicly available data and resources to support jurisdictional and community partners implementing local, regional and state transportation safety plans.

At the September meeting, JPACT members requested additional information for the monthly traffic death updates, including numbers of fatal crashes by jurisdiction. Metro staff developed the Fatal Crash Dashboard using data from the Oregon Department of Transportation to provide up-to-date information on traffic deaths in the region. Information in the Fatal Crash Dashboard can be filtered by date, county, Metropolitan Planning Area and Urban Growth Boundary, and Metro Council District. The Dashboard provides number of fatal crashes for pedestrians, bicyclists, and fatal crashes involving drugs and alcohol. An interactive map shows the location of the fatal crash and allows the user to see the Google Street View. Metro provided a link to the dashboard at the October JPACT meeting.
