**Staff Report** 

Staff and presenters provided an overview of the grant program and the funding recommendations, as described in Exhibit A to the resolution. Presenters also reviewed the

Councilor Rosenthal asked for additional information about habitat restoration projects and details of education programs connected to restoration.

Councilor Hwang appreciated the framework for evaluating project values and leveraging resources, and Councilor Gonzalez appreciated that the investments reach families and communities in need of access to nature.

Councilor Lewis highlighted the need for partnerships outside government to support nature education and access to green spaces, and she asked for additional information about the physical spaces that would be improved alongside education through this grant program.
