Industrial Land Readiness

- SB 1526 – RSIS
Sunset Extension
(PASSED)
- HB 4042- RSIS
Funding **(FAILED)**




Equitable & Achievable Housing Production



- HB 4063 – OHNA Amendments in urban unincorporated areas **(PASSED)**
- HB 1530 – Housing infrastructure funding **(PASSED)**

Urban Growth Management

- SB 1537 – Governor’s Housing package that included a one-time UGB expansion (**PASSED**)
- HB 4026 - UGB Amendment Ballot Referrals (**PASSED**)



Regional Economic Recovery and Growth

- \$2.5 Million to Greater Portland Inc.
- \$11.8 Million for arts and cultural organizations
- \$20 Million to ODOT to clean up their right of ways
- \$8 Million for the Economic Equity and Investment Program



Columbia River Levees

SB 1517 – Revenue raising tools for
the Urban Flood Safety and Water
Quality District (**PASSED**)



Convenient Electronic Reuse

SB 1596 – Right to Repair
(PASSED)



Hillsboro Hops Stadium Improvements

\$15 Million in state funding for a new, city-owned ballpark secured.
