Revenue needs recommendation

Goals:

Advance Council & Task Force goals & outcomes

Deliver transformative project & program investments

Fulfill community visions and needs

Revenue need: \$250 million/year

Meeting revenue need: Options

Scenario A

Payroll tax: .65% + Vehicle reg. fee: \$38/year

Scenario B

Payroll tax:
.6% in 2022,
step to .75% in 2026
No vehicle reg. fee

Both scenarios:

Tax collection begins 2022 Small businesses exempt from payroll tax Initial project investment (bonding) begins 2021

Investment timeline: Notes

Regionwide programs:

Fully funded

Corridors:

Allows most projects to advance within 15 years

Project delivery refinement



Project delivery refinement approach

Continuing community & partner engagement

Continue to engage partners on project cost containment

Identify projects to advance after 15-year window, unless funding is available sooner

Re-scope key projects as needed, based on available funding & timing










