## Tier 2 Corridors: Background

Designated by Council, June 2019

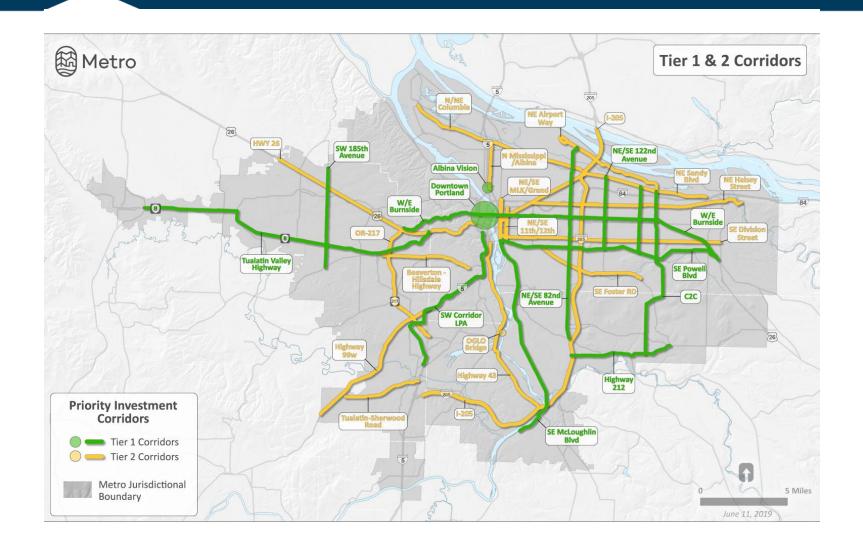
Eligible for capital and/or planning investments

Intended to complement, not replace Tier 1 corridors & programs

Jurisdiction proposals for review by Task Force and Council

### Criteria to advance: Tier 2 corridors

Corridor & investments align with Task Force & Metro Council desired outcomes

Investments supported by community

Investments bring resources to areas not already in the measure

Highway 217 Planning, Design and Construction	Washington County	Corridor planning: \$2 million Prelim. engineering: \$25-27 million Project design/construction: \$105-125 million
Highway 43 Construction	West Linn	\$54 million
Highway 99W Corridor Planning	Washington County	\$3.5-5 million
Sunset/Highway 26 Corridor Planning	Hillsboro	\$1.3 million

## Highway 217

**Proposed by Washington County** 

## Three phases of proposed regional investment:

- Corridor planning \$2 million
- Preliminary engineering \$25-27 million
- Project design/construction \$105-125 million



## Highway 217

#### Task Force feedback

Some members: Question regional measure investment in freeway

Other members: Recognizing corridor's significance, support at least corridor planning

#### Staff recommendation

**\$2 million** for multimodal corridor planning, including parallel and cross routes

\$10 million for second phase of project development building on findings of corridor study

## Highway 43 safety

Proposed by West Linn

Sidewalks, bicycle facilities, transit stops, intersections & turn lanes between Hidden Springs Lane and I-205

Proposed regional investment: \$54 million (revised)



## Highway 43 safety

#### Task Force feedback

- Near universal support
- Some questions about completing design on an state-owned road
- Discussion of racial equity

#### Staff recommendation

Fully fund \$54 million proposal

## Highway 99W planning

Proposed by Washington County in partnership with Tigard, Tualatin

Planning to improve multimodal safety, transportation system management, economic activity and land use potential

**Proposed regional investment:** \$3.5-5 million



## **Highway 99W planning**

#### Task Force feedback

- Broad support overall
- Some members to ensure study prioritizes safety and transit mobility

#### Staff recommendation

Fund corridor study at \$3.5 million

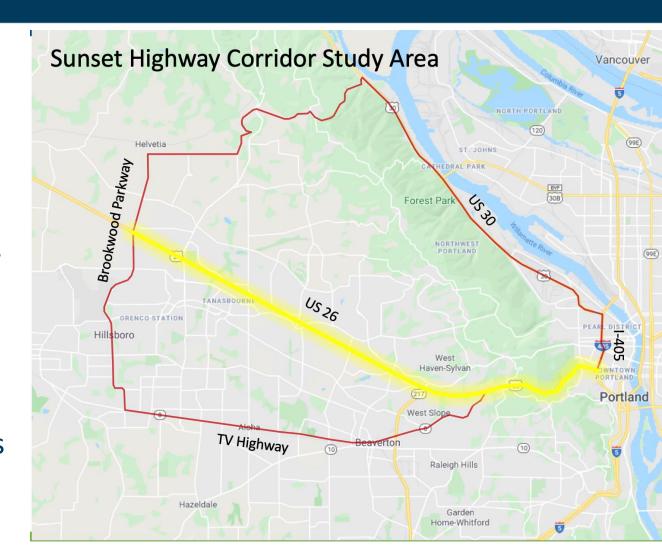
## **Sunset Corridor planning**

Proposed by City of Hillsboro

Corridor planning to reduce congestion & crashes and increase transit use (proposed study area, right)

## Proposed regional investment:

\$1.3 million (matches state & local funds)



## **Sunset Corridor planning**

#### Task Force feedback:

- General concern about clarity of outcomes & potential options for study
- Concern about studying possible investments through or under Forest Park

#### Staff recommendation:

- Do not include for regional funding
- State and local funds can support study

# Council direction: What happens next

Move forward with jurisdiction partners: Assess cost/risk, refine scopes

Finalize corridor investment recommendation to Council

No further distinction between Tier 1 and 2 corridors
