WHEREAS, the Metro Code requires a non-system license of any person that transports solid waste generated from within the Metro Region to a non-system disposal facility; and

WHEREAS, City of Roses Disposal & Recycling filed a solid waste facility franchise application seeking to operate a transfer station and accept up to 15,000 tons of putrescible waste in calendar year 2019; and

WHEREAS, City of Roses Disposal & Recycling holds Metro Solid Waste Facility Non-System License No. N-134-16C, which authorizes City of Roses Disposal & Recycling to transport and dispose of up to 472 tons of putrescible waste per calendar year at Wasco County Landfill and, during certain unusual circumstances and emergency situations, at Cowlitz County Headquarters Landfill; and

WHEREAS, City of Roses Disposal & Recycling seeks to amend the current non-system license to increase the tonnage authorization up to 15,000 tons in calendar year 2019 to align it with the proposed franchise tonnage allocation; and

WHEREAS, Metro Code Chapter 5.05 provides that the Chief Operating Officer will review a request to amend a non-system license for putrescible waste and that Metro Council may approve or deny the amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Operating Officer recommends that Metro Council approve amendment of City of Roses Disposal & Recycling's non-system license to increase the non-system license tonnage authorization to align that waste amount with the facility's franchise tonnage allocation; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that (1) the requested amendment of City of Roses Disposal & Recycling's non-system license is approved subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations contained in this Resolution and Exhibit A, (2) the Chief Operating Officer is authorized to issue an amended Solid Waste Facility Non-System License substantially similar to the one attached as Exhibit A which replaces and supersedes the current non-system license for City of Roses Disposal & Recycling.
